VII. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

A. Mr. Joseph Graff (no address given) approached Council in reference to the following items:

1. Conduct of Council at last few meetings and length of time a person can speak;
2. Employee's name brought up at meeting; should have been stopped by Council and brought up before the Mayor, Chief of Police, and Public Safety Chairman.
3. Has attended three meetings, and two citizens present again at tonight's meeting have not been helped.  
Council should steer them in the right direction.

B. Ms. Mary Lou Caton, of 123 East College Street, informed Council that John Kosek, Sr. owns a house behind her (123 ½ East College Street) that is known in the area as a "crack" house. She has been informed by John Kosek, Jr. that St. Genevieve Church is being bought by the Elks. The church house (120 East College Street) next to it is empty, and John Kosek, Sr. intends to buy that house and turn it into the same type (\$75 week sleeping rooms) of house as the one across the street from her. Ms. Caton wanted to know if anything could be done to stop this.

Ms. Caton expanded on the numerous problems she is experiencing with the residents of 123 ½ East College Street. (Seven people currently live there.)

a tenant moves out of one of the rooms to prevent it from being rented again.

Attorney Derrico will meet with Mr. Cianelli to review this matter. Mr. Caruso advised Ms. Caton to continue to call the police when there is a problem.

Ms. Caton's daughter (name not given) also informed Council of additional problems with the residents of 123 12 East College.

C. Mr. Dale Wagner, of 701 Fountain Street, has been told by the Code Enforcement Officer that there is a culvert under his barn. He said there has never been a culvert there; it's just an open pipe. When he moved in seven years ago, there was a ravine from that pipe to the top of the hill, and there was no parking there. Mr. Wagner said he took 60 feet of pipe, tapped into the open pipe, and took it straight up the hill. Water goes through where it's still open now.

Mr. Wagner has heard there were complaints, but he said there is no problem. He also heard people were complaining it caused a flood, but he said he had pictures to prove that this is not true. (Council viewed the pictures.)

Discussion was held pertaining to the fact that Mr. Wagner had been given approval in the past by an official to install the pipe, putting dye in the line, the Code Enforcement Officer's recommendation that the shed should be torn down, and the fact that Mr. Wagner did not secure a permit to build the barn/shed.

It was decided that the Engineer will check and TV the line, and the Code Enforcement Officer will come back to Council with a written recommendation.

- D. Mr. Joseph Dino (no address given) spoke with Council concerning various ongoing problems:
1. Mr. Wagner's shed, which Mr. Dino said borders Madonna's property – not Mr. Wagner's property;
  2. Flooding because of the pipe to which Mr. Wagner made reference (in Item C above) and who will be responsible

3. Determination of property line/Borough boundaries;

Mrs. Popp reported that she and Mr. Sharkady called both Ms. Altland and Mr. Dellorso in to the office to resolve this issue.

RESOLUTION: Ms. Altland took the bill (which was in excess of \$7,000), and it will be paid by the Sewer Authority. Mrs. Popp stated that Ms. Altland knows to never do this again.

Mr. Sharkady explained that this was a new chemical that the company (Sieman) said was better than the one that was being used. However, Mr. Dellorso did not agree. The company told Ms. Altland they would give it to them on a trial basis, but Ms. Altland had to order \$7,000 worth (instead of just a few barrels) in order to try it.

Mr. Hazlett informed Council that the money (which totaled approximately \$13,000) was coming out of the Operations Account, which is Borough money. Because it was ordered without approval of the plant supervisor and borough engineer, the money had to come out of the Sewer account. Mr. Hazlett said that Ms. Altland agreed to this.

Further discussion was held pertaining to the chemical. Mr. Hazlett informed Council that Ms. Altland was asked to return the remainder to the company.
