PUBLIC COMMENTS:

1. Colleen Millen, representing her mother who resides at 228 East Pitt Street, approached Council asking for help with issues involving cats. She stated that cats, she believes are her mother's neighbor's, dig holes in the yard and defecate in the yard/holes. She stated there are 14-20 holes in her mother's yard. She stated it is a health and safety issue. She stated her mother has special grass that may be attracting the cats. She stated the neighbor admitted they are her cats. Mrs. Millen cited Borough code 72-02 and 72-03, which is a nuisance code. She stated her mother spoke to Mayor Rhome on December 14, 2015 in which he stated he would be involved to get help for her. Ms. Millen stated Mayor Rhome called her sister that evening and promised the same. She stated there has been no further follow up. She stated it could be a project for the Council members on the Code Committee. Mr. Severine asked if Ms. Nester has been to her house to set traps, set up a camera and set bait to catch the cats. Ms. Millen said she has made extremely minimal effort and left a trap for a couple hours. Mr. Bell asked Mayor Rhome to comment on this situation. Mayor Rhome stated that her mother addressed the President of the Council at the last meeting. The President of the Council asked Mayor Rhome to speak to her mother. At that time, he asked her to give him thirty days to see how to handle the situation as there is no state law in regards to cats and the current ordinance is very vague as far as what happens after the code. He stated the Council does have a Cat Committee with the assistance of Gina Nester and a Cat Captain from different vicinities in the Borough. Mayor Rhome said he met with Ms. Millen's mother a second time; she listened to what he had to say, however, she was not receptive. He stated Ms. Nester was involved and has corresponded via emails. Mayor Rhome cited a recent email from Ms. Nester indicating she walked the property every few days and stated there are no holes or defecation in the yard. Ms. Nester indicated she was at a loss as what to do as they see holes that no one else sees and no defecation. Mayor Rhome further stated that Ms. Millen's mother indicated she would be going to bring legal action against Ms. Nester. The Mayor asked Council which direction Ms. Nester should go. Mr. Kipp stated that what Mayor Rhome stated was word for word. Mr. Bell said that he is aware of the problem. The Mayor also stated

he spoke to Code Enforcement today. Ms. Millen stated she is animal lover; however, the Cat Program is not being managed. She stated she has picture proof of the holes. Ms. Millen stated the code is not vague as it states cats are not permitted on others property and cannot cause a nuisance as well as the ordinance specifies fines. Ms. Millen stated they may have to pursue legal action.

Charlotte Carrow, another daughter stated Code Enforcement informed her there are no limits on the number of cats. Ms. Carrow said the issue is they are asking for help and somehow the cats need to be kept on her property and not allowed to roam and cause damage to her mother's property. She stated she has two pictures on her phone of the holes in her mother's yard. Mayor Rhome stated that the Code Enforcement Department does not know what else to do. Mayor Rhome stated there is no proof the cats belong to the neighbor.

Mr. Derrico stated they have the right to pursue a private suit with the magistrate as it is a civil matter, they do not need the Borough.

Ms. Millen stated she has other options and could leave poison out for the cats.

Mr. Bell stated the Borough does not want that. The Mayor said that Code told him the ordinance mentions cats but they have to find out who the cats belong to as the neighbor says it is not her cats.

Mr. Bell stated he would speak with Code, review the ordinance and work with the Mayor and Code Enforcement. Discussion regarding cameras to prove whose cats they are. Ms. Millen said Ms. Nester was to have a trail camera mounted on the neighbor's fence and that has not happened yet.

Mrs. Coleman stated if there is an ordinance, then it should be enforced.

2. Cindy Davis, 415 Giffin Avenue, Canonsburg, Pa, approached Council regarding her neighbors at 425 Giffin. Her neighbors were unable to attend the meeting. She stated rain water is running into their basement since the recent paving; this was not an issue prior to the paving. Mr. Kipp to look into the matter with the Street Superintendent.

Voting Items:

1. Motion to approve the meeting Minutes of December 14, 2015 to not include the Sewer Authority appointments.

Motion by Mr. Bowman to approve the meeting Minutes of December 14, 2015. Seconded by Mr. McGarry.

All in favor.

Mr. Sharkady stated at that meeting there was a vote to have the Sewer Authority members elected, and actually in October, November and December. The terms of the members did not expire until December 31st of 2015. Therefore, the Borough should be nominating new people for the Sewer Authority tonight for all four of them. He stated there is a new Sewer Authority that the Borough does not have anything to do with such as how much money they can spend, how much rate increases are going to be, or tap fees or how much money they can spend on capital improvements. Mr. Sharkady stated they need to make new appointments to that committee and do so tonight. Mr. Sharkady stated since he was part of that meeting, he is going to vote, "No."

Mr. Bell asked for comment. Mr. Kipp stated that when the appointments were made originally, the Sewer Authority was going through their transition. Mr. Kipp said the Solicitor for the Sewer Authority reached out in October with the one appointment, it was going to expire in December, 31, 2015 so he asked the Borough to reappoint so the term ends the following year.

Mr. Bell stated he was present at the one meeting, and the question came up if Council should do that.

Mr. Bell stated at that time Council said "yes, they had to" and went ahead and voted everyone in. Mr. Bell asked Mr. Derrico if that was proper.

Mr. Derrico stated as far as he was concerned, the motion was proper at that time.

Mr. Sharkady stated that Council also voted at that meeting in October, without receiving a resignation

from Mr. Bevec, who was on the Board, to accept Mr. Maund to the Sewer Authority. Mr. Sharkday said Mr. Maund was not nominated by anyone on Council. He stated Mr. Maund does not belong on the Authority unless he is voted on tonight. Mr. Sharkady asked Mr. Derrico if that was correct.

Mr. Derrico stated, "No." As far as he is concerned, it was a nomination that night.

Mr. Sharkady stated there was no nomination and Mr. Bevec did not resign to have an open seat.

Mr. Derrico stated Mr. Bevec's term ran out and the new people started January 1, 2016, is the way he read the motion.

Mr. Sharkady stated the terms did not expire until December 31, of this year. Therefore, you cannot appoint someone to a term that has not expired unless someone resigns.

Mr. Derrico stated you can make a motion to begin January 1; they have no duties until January 2016.

Mr. Sharkady stated Mr. Maund has been sitting on the Authority since October. Mr. Sharkady does attend every meeting.

Mr. Derrico stated his duty was to begin January 1, 2016, is how he read it.

Mr. Sharkady stated Mr. Maund has made motions and voted on items.

Mr. Derrico said Mr. Sharkady can make a motion to object to Mr. Maund's appointment.

Mr. Severine asked how this could have happened.

Mr. Derrico stated the Borough made a motion that was suppose to be January 1, 2016. Mr. Derrico further stated he is not the Sewer Authority's Solicitor and it is up to the Authority's Solicitor to determine if Mr. Maund has the authority to vote.

Mr. Sharkady said is up to Council to put Mr. Maund on that committee and he was not put on that Board by Council.

Mr. Severine asked if this could be tabled until they find out more information.

Mr. Bell asked Mr. Derrico and Mr. Kipp to research this for next month's Agenda meeting.

Mr. Kipp suggested a call to Ms. Katherine Gilmartin, the Sewer Authority manager.

Mr. Sharkady said they only standing the Borough has with the Sewer Authority is they appoint the four people from Canonsburg to be on the Authority. Mr. Sharkady said they may have to advertise in the newspaper for qualified people to sit on the Authority and pick the best people to have some fairness as to what is going on with the Sewer Authority.

Mr. Bell said there are two issues; they appointed people in December of last year as their terms were running out. Second, should Mr. Maund started in January 2015?

Mr. Derrico stated he and Mr. Kipp would review the minutes and sort it out. Mr. Derrico stated his recollection was for Mr. Maund's appointment to start January 1, 2016. Mr. Derrico stated he does not attend the Sewer Authority meetings and was not aware who was voting.

Mr. Bell stated the Authority has a Solicitor who should know if Mr. Maund could vote.

Mr. Derrico said the minutes could be approved subject to this one item.

2. Motion to approve the meeting Minutes of December 21, 2015.

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS:

Mr. Bell stated the new Council may have extra meetings to catch up on what is going on.

Outstanding Committee Reports

1. Administration and Finance: Mrs. Coleman motioned to pay the bills. Mrs. Coleman suggested that Committee reports be submitted to Denise. Mr. Severine stated Mr. Russo will come to the Borough every three months to provide a report on the Park Committee.
2. Mr. Kipp stated they are getting an appraisal next week on the old bookstore, getting costs if they tear it down. Mayor Rhome would like to share something in Executive Session.
3. Code Enforcement-nothing to report per Mr. Severine
4. Park Committee- will have something next month, per Mr. Severine.
3. Public Safety- Mr. McGarry reported on Public Safety- December Fire Report 2015- The Canonsburg Volunteer Fire Department responded to 1 structural fire call, 5 emergency calls, 3 alarm calls, 1 rescue call, 1 assistance call with an average of 6 men per calls and spending an average of 55 minutes per call. Total reportable damages for the month is \$500.00.
6. Sewage/Public Works-nothing to report.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

1. Police Department monthly report provided to Council for review. Almost 4,000 miles patrolled throughout the Borough. 541 calls answered by the Police Department.
2. Parking Enforcement Monthly report provided for review. Permits still available.
3. 2 handicap parking requests. Met with the applicants, application in order and the applicants understand the rules and regulations.
617 Duquesne Avenue
621 Highland Avenue
4. Paving- Cavasina Street and Munnell Street are deplorable and a really bad job.
5. Cat Complaint- Mayor Rhome stated that Ms. Nestor should cease and desist if there is a possibility she could have legal action against her, especially if she is trying to do good in the community.
6. Final Civil Service report will be provided to Council next month
7. The new prison cell doors have been installed at no charge due to a prisoner damaging the doors. If restitution is made the payment can be forwarded to the company of the doors.
8. South Central Elementary School has an open position for a crossing guard a few hours a day.
9. Operation Holiday Slow Down was successful with approximately 65 citations given between December 24th and January first. Also found drivers without licenses and other infractions.
10. One sided street parking- if a special event, residents can notify the Police Department Monday through Friday of having additional parking. Special parking on the other side of the street will be granted.
11. Highland Avenue and Short Street- the curbing was damaged during the paving
12. Re-Cycling Program at Washington Fair Grounds on 2-2-16, with cooperation of the Washington County Planning Commission from 2-5 pm. This will be monthly except for August.
13. Motorcycle group in town for a funeral was professional, orderly and law enforcement did a good job.
14. Mayor Rhome stated an Executive Session is necessary
15. Door to Door scam regarding the sales of vacuums as scene in Bethel Park and on television. Mayor Rhome spotted the group in town and police handled.
Mr. Severine inquired about handling handicap signs. Mr. Coghill stated it is being addressed.
Mr. Severine inquired about a pay raise for crossing guards and if the school made up the difference. Mayor Rhome stated they were to in June. Mr. Severine asked who is handling the school crossing guard. Mr. Coghill stated the Police Department. Mr. Severine asked Mr. Bell why an officer is taken of the street and why not have the school handle the situation. Mayor Rhome said ultimately the safety of the children are foremost and if it takes a police officer, he is willing to do that until a crossing guard

is hired. Mayor Rhome stated they have invested time over the years to have someone from the schools train the crossing guards. Mr. Severine stated he understands, however, asked if the meter maid could be utilized vs. a police officer. Mr. Coghill stated it would be a union issue. Mr. Coghill said the problem is finding someone to give up a their day for a few hours. Mayor Rhome said there is a memo through the school, on the Borough website and marquee outside. Mr. Bell inquired about advertising on social media.

Mr. Severine mentioned a microbrewery coming in town in July and there are residents that have parking permits in that spot. He asked how many parking permits there are in that spot. Mr. Coghill was not certain. Mr. Severine stated he was looking in the future. Mayor Rhome stated they have the latitude to move patrons. Mr. Severine stated people are being forced further away. Mr. Bell stated the Police Department will come up with a solution and look at how many parking permits there are. Mr. Severine suggested, at a previous meeting, if meters could be placed on one side of the street and the road being widened. Mr. Treschow stated he has not followed up yet.

Mr. Sharkady stated that a vote was taken at the December 14, 2015 meeting to hire two part-time police officers. He asked Mr. Bevec, President, at that time, if these position were advertised in the newspapers. Mr. Bevec assured Mr. Sharkady that they were advertised. Mr. Sharkady asked Mr. Kipp for a copy of the ad and was told he did not think there was any and he did not think it was advertised. Mr. Kipp agreed it was not advertised. Mr. Sharkady said there are many other employees hired in the borough without any advertisement as to the qualifications of these applicants. Some at that time and some still not qualified. He stated the employees are paid very well and as such our taxpayers deserve the very best that the Borough can get, especially the senior citizens who many struggle to pay their food, taxes and medications. Mr. Sharkady stated, "Getting back to the non-advertising for openings leads me to believe Canonsburg Borough is not an equal opportunity employer and who knows what that could lead to in the future, There was also a vote for these officers that ended in a 3-3 tie that was broken by Mayor Rhome, who normally has tie breaking voting privileges, except, as in this case, and is important to note, the Mayor cannot vote on hiring or firing of police personnel or if there is a conflict of interest, both of which apply in this instance. As the Mayor may be a relative of one of the applicants and he is also in charge of the Police Department. At the same meeting, a paid fireman was also hired under the same circumstances where Mayor Rhome broke a 3-3 tie vote in favor of hiring a paid fireman. Along with hiring a Borough employee, Mayor Rhome is also the Assistant Fire Chief and he recommended Mr. Brown to be hired. Both conflicts of interest. These issues are governed by Pennsylvania case law and public officials in the Employees Ethics Act 65 PA, CSA, section 11-01 and 11-02. The subjects mentioned are just a few that should and need to be re-visited and corrected in this new year. I, for one, will no longer stand by without taking appropriate actions, with proper jurisdictions for blatant ethics violations." For the record, Mr. Sharkady stated he would like a legal opinion on these subjects from the Borough Solicitor, especially under new hires of the police and fireman. Mr. Sharkady further stated, "After speaking with several residents regarding Borough government, some are appalled at the nepotism that occurs in the Borough."

Mr. Derrico stated he disagrees with Mr. Sharkady's opinion about the Mayor breaking a tie. Mr. Derrico further said as far as the Borough code reads, he can break a tie for anything. Mr. Derrico said the section that Mr. Sharkady referred was provided by Wendy Nickerson, who wrote the article. Mr. Derrico stated he has been in touch with her. She referred to Mr. Derrico article 11 Sections E 11 21, which talks about the civil service and the Mayor does not have the right to vote in the civil service, however, the Mayor has the right to break the tie. Mr. Derrico stated Wendy Nickerson quoted an article out of book; Mr. Derrico had a copy of that book and stated he would provide Mr. Sharkady with a copy of the section Ms. Nickerson quoted after the meeting. Mr. Derrico again stated the section is all concerning the civil service and not breaking a tie; the Mayor has the right to break a tie on every

issue that comes up. Mr. Sharkady thanked Mr. Derrico.

Mayor Rhome stated he would like to go on record that as far as Mr. Sharkady's comment about a family member being a hired, he is wrong. He further stated there are no family members he hired in this Borough or a vote that was taken. At the direction of the Solicitor he has given Mayor Rhome the time and place that he needed to vote to break a tie, at his recommendation.

Engineer's Report:

Mr. Treschow reported on the following:

1. 2015 Road/Alley Project- final inspection and punch list to be completed. None of the work completed by Russell has been accepted. HMT has discussed many issues with them. The invoice will not be paid at this time. HMT has already rejected Munnell Street as being paid at any time.
2. PAD Chartiers Creek Flood Protection Grant- the Army Core of Engineers does an inspection of the Flood Control project every year and this has been completed,. There is one deficient item which is the removal of some big trees. This will keep the Borough in acceptable status to receive additional grants. There should be money left this spring to hire someone to remove those trees and do another defoliation on the banks.
3. Falconi Ball Fields-everything submitted to their Solicitor to go over what they would like in their lease. No reply since December.
4. McBurney Road and Water Alley Flood Control Projects- due to the extensive scope of work, had to take care of the most serious first. Will use grant monies to complete that work.
5. UCC Building Inspection report for December - 2 permits issued
6. Canonsburg Planning Commission that was held on January 7, 2016 denied Extenet application for the installment of 4 forty-five foot high wooden telephone poles in various places in the community.

Extenet did not have anyone at the meeting to represent them. The Planning Commission Solicitor said without talking to them that he could not determine if they were considered a public utility which effects zoning wise what they can and cannot do.

Mr. Sharkady inquired about 4 West Pike Street. Mr. Treschow stated he did not know and to call the office tomorrow. HMT did an inspection on it and he can have someone call him tomorrow.

Mr. Severine stated he attended the Planning Meeting, he spoke to people in East End and they do not want all those poles. Mr. Kipp said that Mr. Jeff Derrico, the Planning Commission Solicitor, was very wise with his decision.
